
Welcome to the 2018 HOLA Signature Event, Celebrating Hispanic Heritage Month.

Each year, Americans observe National Hispanic Heritage Month from Sept. 15 to Oct. 15 to celebrate the tradition, history, food, language and culture of our ancestors who hailed from Spain, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Central and South America.

In 1968, HHM started as a commemorative week, and later expanded to a 30-day period in 1988. Within these 30 days, five Latin American countries will honor their independence, including Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. Of course, Mexico, Chile and Belize also celebrate during this period, with Columbus Day (Dia de la Raza) on Oct. 12.1 Communities near and far pay tribute through festivals, government-sponsored activities and educational activities for students.




